MINUTES

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE EAST SEVIER COUNTY UTILITY DISTRICT

Thursday, April 09, 2020

The Board of Commissioners of the East Sevier County Utility District met at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 09, 2020, in the Office of the East Sevier County Utility District, 1529 Alpine Drive, Sevierville, TN 37876. Commissioners present were Roy Ivey, President; Barbara Darby, Secretary/Treasurer; and Janice Brooks-Headrick.

President Roy Ivey called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. for any old or new business.

A motion to approve the minutes of the March 12, 2020, meeting was made by Barbara; Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the Accounts Payable listing in total as submitted was made by Barbara; Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Reports

Evan Romo, Division Manager, went over key points of the financial packet. Barbara motioned to approve the financial report as presented, Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Evan discussed Appendices A & B, which was included in the Board packet. Appendix A and Appendix B list the water and sewer rate structure as they are set up in the billing system. The Rules and Regulations previously listed the water rates as \$53.00 for the first 3,000 gallons and \$3.00 per addition thousand gallons or portion thereof. However, the billing software is set up to charge a \$12.60 flat fee and \$8.00 per additional 1,000 gallons or portion thereof for usage over 7,200 gallons, which adds an incentive for customers to be conservative with their water usage and to repair leaks in a timely manner.

The sewer rates are listed on Appendix B as \$45 for the first 3,000 gallons, \$3.10 per additional 1,000 gallons or portion thereof, and a \$13.86 flat fee and \$8.80 per additional 1,000 gallons or portion thereof. Barbara motioned to add Appendix A and Appendix B to the Rules and Regulations, and Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried. Evan noted that the rates are not changing but merely being reflected correctly in the Rules and Regulations.

Evan discussed the memo to the Board that was included in the Board packet. The memo stated, "ESCUD has historically used Mitchell Emert & Hill, P.C., to perform the

District's annual audits. As we look forward to the upcoming audit, staff recommends seeking Requests for Qualifications from additional firms in order to obtain a fair price and acceptable service." He reminded the Board that Mitchell Emert & Hill charged around \$1,000 more each year for the last 2-3 audits. Also, they have been slow to submit their findings. Barbara motioned to approve looking to other firms to find the best price and service for future audits. Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried. James discussed operations for March. AT&T Fiber Optic Internet has been installed, improving our service exponentially. We had the transmission serviced on an ESCUD vehicle. We flushed the entire distribution system and replaced filters at the A/B well house. We dressed up and raked a repair site to make it look much better. A water leak was repaired on Black Oak, and a sewer leak was addressed at Bear Creek Crossing.

Offsite, we installed a control box and three pump kits at Sherwood Forest and installed two pump kits at Smoky Mountain Ridge.

James reported the status of the Douglas Lake landslide, which exposed and pulled apart our sewer lateral. Markers had been put into place, and a study of them showed that the soil had moved six inches since they were placed; the movement was strong enough to break one of the markers. We have repaired the sewer laterals, but there is a good possibility that they will pull apart again.

Our March safety meetings were in regard to COVID-19. There will be more on that subject in coming months. Monthly water and wastewater reports were submitted to TDEC. A staff member has been scheduled to take a collections examination in May.

Persons to be Heard

Jeff Bragonier, an ESCUD employee, requested permission to purchase the 2008 Chevy that is part of the ESCUD fleet for \$500. We had received bids of \$375, \$450, and \$475. It was the consensus of the Board to allow Jeff to purchase the 2008 Chevy for \$500.

April 2020

Administrative

Alliance staff are gathering information to create the FYE21 budget.

Treatment

Treatment at the wells is monitored daily. Water treatment has continually improved since the installation of the filters at well C.

Treatment at the wastewater plant is effective. All monthly parameters were met within permit limits for the month.

Collection/Distribution

Installed two (2) pump kits at Smoky Mountain Ridge.

Installed three (3) pump kits at Timber Lake Resort.

Installed water tap for new customer on Lin Creek.

Repaired sewer lateral at Douglas Lake Resort.

Replaced all intake hoses on the #1 Stenner Pump at A/B well house.

Spread dirt, seed and straw on customers yard at previous repair site

Customer Service

A customer from the English Mountain Condos stated to staff members that the water quality is much higher than it was before the arrival of AWR.

Project Updates

McGill is preparing final plans to present to TDEC on the WWTP. An updated project schedule has been delivered to TDEC.

Safety

Our April safety meeting was regarding COVID 19.

Regulatory

Monthly Water and Wastewater reports were successfully submitted to the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation.

Training

Trained new employee on offsite activities for water and wastewater. New Local Manager started on April 13th, being trained and familiarized with ESCUD and AWR operations.

Concerns for the Month

The booster pump at Well C constantly ran for several days with a 135 PSI line pressure. There could be possible additional line leaks due to the constant higher pressure on our older infrastructure.

Positives for the Month

A difficult to locate water leak was finally found and mitigated. This brought Well C booster pump back normal operation and the Well C tank level back to normal operating levels.

Leak Repairs

Water leaks were addressed at several locations: Chestnut Ridge Glascow, Half High, Clingman's View and Alpine Drive.

A sewer leak was addressed at Bear Creek Crossing.

Re: Replacement of 2003 Ford Ranger

As you know, ESCUD's work truck fleet is aging and all trucks are in need of various repairs. Recently, the 2003 Ford Ranger has broken down. The repair estimate is \$7,600 to replace various parts including the engine. The truck would be valued at \$1,554 if it were in fair condition and running. In August of 2019, the Board approved \$25,000-\$30,000 for the purchase of a small van. We would recommend re-appropriating these funds for the purchase of a small truck. An additional \$30,000 is being recommended in the capital improvement budget for FYE2021 to purchase another Ranger. We will roll this over to total \$55,000 in the FYE2021 budget.

The other two vehicles currently used for ESCUD daily operations are the 1998 Ford F350 Utility Truck with 150,000+ miles on it and a 1999 Mazda B4000 Pickup truck with 212,000+ miles on it. Both of these vehicles are in need of some repairs, (ie, brakes/rotors, alignment, and tires) both vehicles have recently had transmission work done on them. The Utility truck is only used to transport needed materials and parts in the service area. Due to its condition it's not driven out of the service area. The AWR manager's truck is being used for daily operations due to the vehicle issues.

Purchasing a new Ford Ranger 4x4 from the state bid list would cost \$25,192 plus tag. We recommend purchasing 2 trucks now for a total of 50,384 before tag and title fees.
